ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- UNICEF the Netherlands will implement the Child Resilience and Protection project (the **Project**). The
 International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (hereinafter the Bank) acting as an administrator
 of Sint Maarten Hurricane Irma Reconstruction, Recovery and Resilience Program Single-Donor Trust Fund
 has agreed to finance the Project.
- UNICEF the Netherlands will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented
 in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social
 Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well
 as the timing for each of these.
- 3. UNICEF the Netherlands will also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the ESSs and referred to in this ESCP, such as the Labor Management Procedures, and the Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Bank by UNICEF the Netherlands as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the project.
- 5. As agreed by the Bank and UNICEF the Netherlands this ESCP may be revised from time to time during project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, UNICEF the Netherlands will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the UNICEF the Netherlands. UNICEF the Netherlands will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 6. Where project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during project implementation, the UNICEF the Netherlands shall seek to provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
